3rd and 4th Amendments:
Protection of Private Property

Double Jeopardy

6th Amendment



Rights of the accused:

- Speedy and public trial
- Tried by an impartial jury
- Must be informed of the nature of the offense
- Entitled to have the assistance of counsel

Rights of the defendant:

- Entitled to confront his accusers
- Entitled to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his behalf

Jury:

- Must be selected from state or district where offense occurred.



In Common Law or Civil Suits, the right of trial by jury shall be preserved.

8th Amendment:

- Excessive bail shall not be required
- Defendant shall not have excessive fines imposed
- Convicted persons shall not be subjected to cruel and unusual punishment

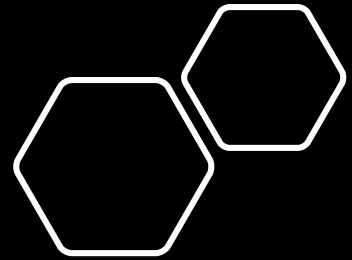
14th Amendment

...nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty, or property, without due process of law; nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

15th Amendment

Section 1. The right of citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of race, color, or previous condition of servitude.

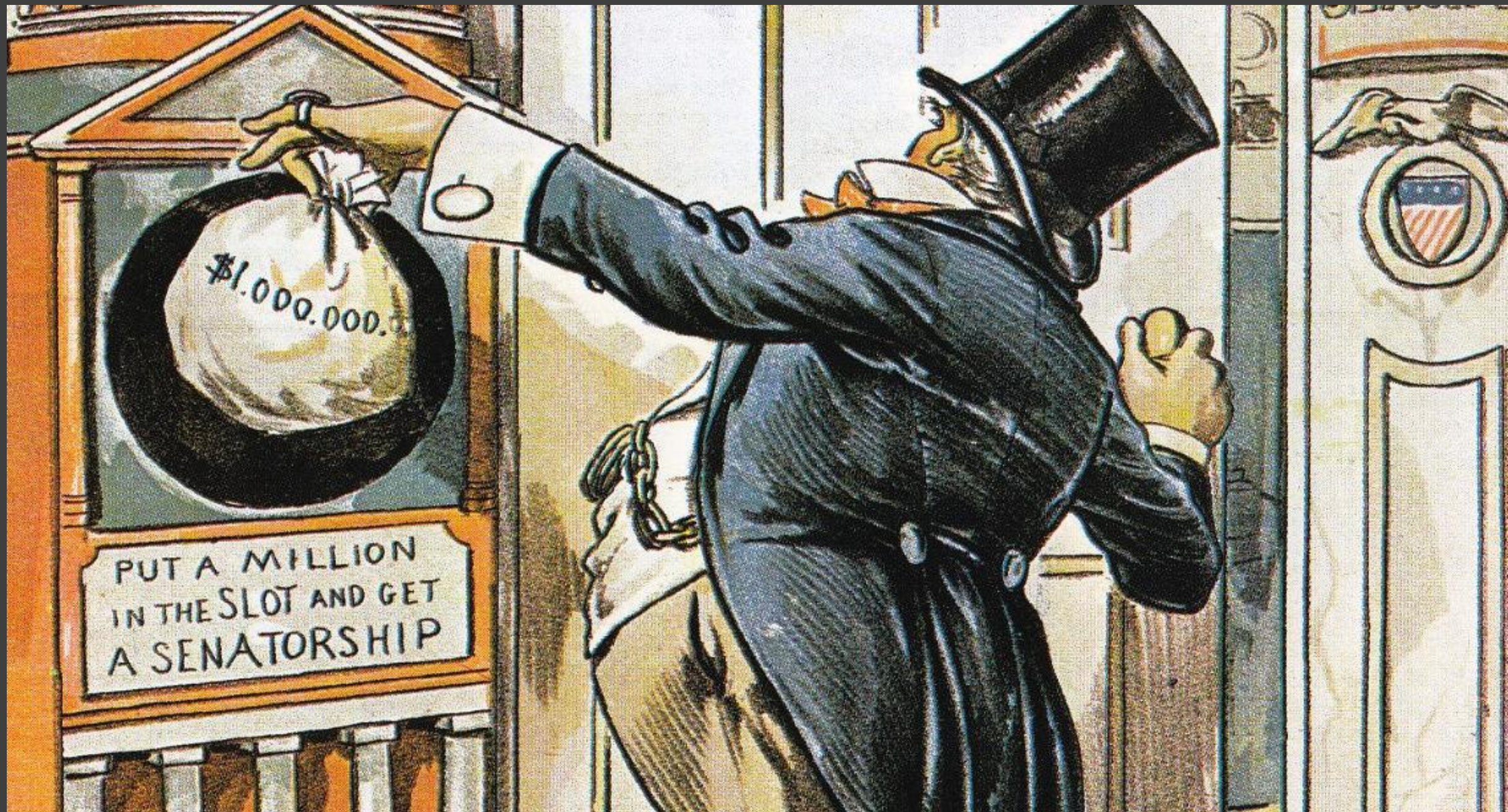
Section 2. The Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.





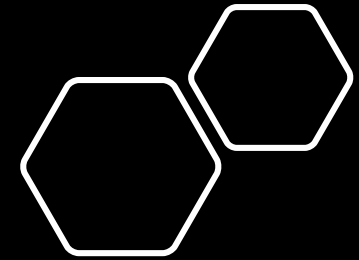
